The Department of Sociology is defined as a branch of science that studies societies in the most general sense.

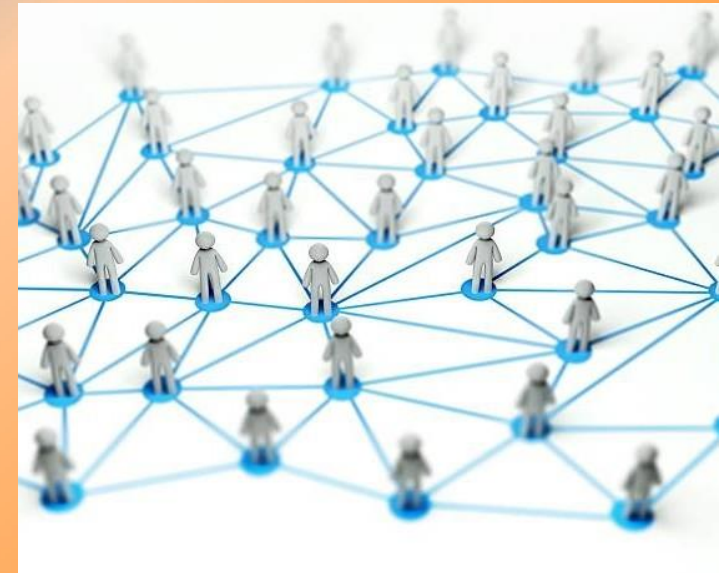


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Siirt University Sociology Department is one of the oldest departments of the university established in 2007. It started its education and training activities with 40 students in 2013-2014 academic year. The total number of current students in 2022-2023 is 215. In 2017, the department gave its first graduates and the master's program is not active due to the lack of sufficient teaching staff. In the academic organization scheme of the department, it consists of four institutions. They collect data through disciplines: General Sociology, Sociology of Institutions, Sociometry (Social Structure and Change) and Applied Sociology. However, a mixed curriculum is applied.

The department itself has 2 Assoc. Prof. Dr., 5 Ph. Member, 1 Dr. Research Assist and 2 Assist. There are 10 academic staff, including 2 Assoc. In our department, which has a young and dynamic academic staff, education and training activities are carried out using the most up-to-date research methods. In addition, our administrative and technical staff work in order to carry out teaching activities in the best way.

In sociology departments, different elements such as law, economics, politics, migration, city are examined and the effects of these phenomena on the individual and society are examined. Sociologists study society and social behavior by examining the processes developed by individuals, cultures, organizations and social sources. They collect data through observations, interviews and other sources.





## Our Vision as a Department

Assimilating the existing accumulation of the discipline of General Sociology, following new developments, translating original works in different languages into Turkish, producing local works within the framework of scientific criteria, comparing different approaches methodologically, comparing different findings as a research data, showing and examining the connections between theory and practice that are important for sociology show the perspective of the department.



## Job opportunities

Students who graduate from the Department of Sociology have a wide range of working areas in both the public and private sectors. First of all, students who receive Pedagogical Formation training are appointed as teachers by the Ministry of National Education. In addition, they have the opportunity to be placed as academicians in departments such as Sociology and Social Work, which are open in almost all universities. Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Family and Social Services are among the institutions where graduates of the Department of Sociology can be appointed as sociologists and social researchers.

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
